

Replacement Confederate Flags

Contents:

There are three sheets of different flags:

- Sheet 1: Three different variations of the Confederate National flag. The Confederate national flag experienced several other changes early in the war as states were added to the new country.
- Sheet 2: Both generic Confederate and unit-specific cavalry guidons and flags.
- Sheet 3: Flags for several different generals and headquarters.

Instructions for use:

- 1. Print the flags.
- 2. Cut them out using a sharp craft knife, like an X-Acto knife with a #11 blade.
- 3. Glue the flags to the figures. I used Elmer's Craft Bond Tacky Glue and it worked great. Tacky Glue is just thickened white glue, so white glue should work well also. I found that aligning and gluing the back ends of the flag first, and then snugging the flag around the flagpole seemed to work best.
- 4. If you want to get fancy, color the exposed edges of the flags with a Sharpie[®] or other marker.
- 5. Once the glue is dry, you can fold or wrinkle the flags to make them "wave."
- 6. Coat the flags with either a 50-50 mix of white glue and water, or a little artist's medium (gloss or matte). This will stiffen the flags a bit and also protect them from wet fingers.
- 7. If you ever want to remove the flags, a quick soak in a little plain water will dissolve either white or tacky glue. They can then be slid off the flagpoles.


